Imagination

Imagination has the power to transform people's lives.

People of any age, but especially young people, live happier and more fulfilled lives if they have healthy bodies and healthy minds. That is why sport and culture are equally important factors in realising our potential. Participants learn life skills like teamwork and striving to improve. Spectators learn to discern beauty and professional skills. Aspiration unlocks the imagination.

The ancient Greeks described the process of releasing, and thereby providing relief from, strong or repressed emotions as catharsis. Their tragedies paradoxically engendered a feeling of well-being. Music performs the same function. Opera, which combines music and theatre, is especially good at it. But opera does not have a monopoly. Dance adds an extreme physical effort, comparable to an athlete's, towards the expression of strong emotions.

The most social of the arts is architecture, because it creates the space in which we live. Whether it is a home or an office, a museum or an opera house or a landscaped park, it invites people to inhabit and use that space, to breathe life into it.

Education is the process by which we learn to live, to understand and develop our mental and physical capabilities and to interact with society. Its primary purpose is to set free our imagination.

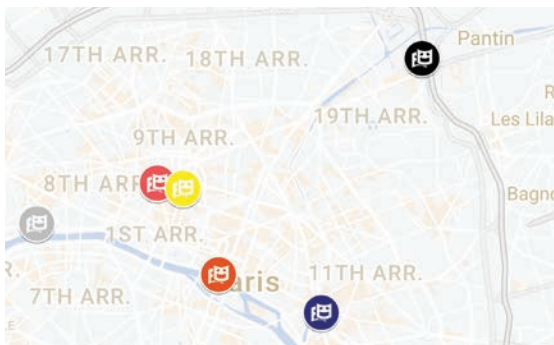

Operabase and Truelinked are now one and the same company

In June 2018, Operabase and Truelinked merged to create a joint venture to provide a greatly extended set of services across the opera profession.

Operabase has documented opera activity around the world for over 20 years, creating the most comprehensive data resource of performances and a toolset that puts this data at the service of opera professionals, as well as the opera-going public. Truelinked is a dynamic company founded in Denmark in 2013 by Sune Hjerrild and Jan Pilgaard Carsen. Truelinked have been developing systems for the better sharing of information within and between opera houses, managers and artists. Their innovative approaches have been rewarded with a Midem Award and gained praise from industry professionals such as Kasper Holten.

The merger in June 2018 marks the start of an expansion, building on the strengths of both companies.

The combination of the unrivalled archives of Operabase, its long experience of the sector, the close working relationship with OE and the extra resources — TL bring 15 people and 4.2m EUR in investment to the joint venture — will allow us to transform the way that the profession works.

The existing Operabase Pro services will continue — the Casting Tool, the archives, the rentals listing. To these will be added new tools and services in the coming months. Truelinked has precise and regularly updated information on role and artist readiness for better jump in tools, and planning auditions. Enhanced casting tools support the creation, annotating and sharing of casting shortlists with colleagues. Many more will follow.
